The Act imposes a self-reporting duty on school authorities, who must prepare an annual statement relating both to their compliance with the duty relating to seat belts imposed by section 1 of this Act and also to the actions which they have been taking to promote and assess the wearing of seat belts by pupils travelling on their dedicated school transport services.

Some pupils travelling on our dedicated school transport may require specialist provision because of an additional support need. Where this is the case, a multidisciplinary assessment will take place to ensure passenger safety. This will include consultancy and advice from Capability Scotland's Health and Safety Advisor.
